You have 3 weeks to work on this unit. Keep in mind that February 14th and 15th are half days. If you are not completing at least 10 points per day, you will be required to work on your project on Fun Fridays

- Do some of your assignments for homework every night to help you stay on track!
- You must turn work into your folder AS YOU COMPLETE IT to receive points. If you turn in all your work on the last day, you will NOT get full points on your work.
- Record all your points on your Unit Sheet (attached).
- Keep all your work organized in a folder to be kept in class. Take home only what you need that night.
- You can choose to research one college for the whole unit or 2 at the most.

- ***We will have access to computers on the following days, so please plan to work on an assignment that needs a computer those days!***

- Everything you need for each assignment is in your folder. You will need a computer or cell phone to research most things.

This unit consists of 5 parts. You may complete them in any order you'd like. Keep track of what you have done and what you still need to do. Choose well and use your time wisely.

Part A - Using Text Features to Make Meaning - 60 points possible

1. State the college you plan on attending and record the GPA of incoming freshmen at that school and your GPA and reflect on how they compare - **10 points**
2. Answer the 9 multiple choice questions in the packet correctly - **18 points**
3. Create your own college infographic - **32 points**

Instructions:

- Research at least 6 categories of information about your college. (Must include admission information)
- Use at least 3 sources for your research.
- Create an innovative format for your infographic on paper (ex. use the school colors, in the form of the school mascot, a pennant) to display the information that you researched.
- Include a title, subheadings for each category, and your sources (correct MLA format)

Part B - College Vocabulary Book - 50 points possible

Part C- Create your own College Pennant - 65 points possible

1. Use campustours.com to complete worksheet outline before doing your pennant - **15 points**
2. Pennant must be decorated correctly and neatly. Color should be used! Follow directions for front and back - **30 points**
3. Completed College Pennant Presentation paper on day of presentations - you are recording what your peers say

about their pennant (Monday 2/25 and Tuesday 2/26) - 20 points

4. You complete a college pennant presentation that follows rubric (Monday 2/25 and Tuesday 2/26) - 20 points

Part D - College Research Newspaper Project - 50 points possible

Part E - Mascot Masks - 10 points possible

1. Create a mask of a college mascot using paper plates, yarn, construction paper, crayons/markers/colored pencils, and glue.
